

Arhaus Inspired End Table

Tools

Saw to cut boards to length Pocket Hole Jig

Drill Sander for finishing wood

Supplies

1 ¼" Pocket Hole Screws Sandpaper

3/8" spade bit 6 -3/8-in-16 x 3-in bolts


6-3/8-in-16 hex nuts 6-3/8-in x 7/8-in flat washers

Paint or stain 1 1/4" wood screws

Optional: Spray paint for bolts, washers, and hex nuts if they are not available in the color of your choice. If spraying, do this before assembling the table. Give the paint plenty of time to dry.



Cut boards according to cut list and drill holes in the 8- 1X3's @ 26" and the 6-1X3's @ 24". Use the 3/8" spade bit for this step.



Drill pocket holes in the 6-1X3 @ 24". This is what the shelf boards will attach to. You will only need two pocket holes per board to support the shelf board sections.





SAWDUST to Sequins

Step 3

Completely sand your boards and paint or stain. This is very difficult to do once the table is assembled.

Step 4

Take 2-1X2 @ 17.5" boards and lay across

7-1X3 @ 18" boards and screw together

with 1 ¼" wood screws. Make three of these.



SAWDUST to Sequins

Place 3-1X3 @ 24" between 2- 1X3 @ 26"
Secure with a bolt, washer, and hex nut. The holes drilled with the spade bit will be the placement of the boards.
tighten nuts to ensure stability of the table.



Step 6

Repeat step 5 to make another table leg unit.

Take the shelf sections you have already assembled from step 4 and attach to the leg units with pocket hole screws.

The shelf units should hang over 1" on

*If some of your nuts and bolts have unpainted surfaces, spray paint on a foam or craft brush and wipe on. Allow adequate time to dry.
