

Arhaus Inspired Coffee Table

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Tools

Saw to cut boards to length

Pocket Hole Jig

Drill

Sander for finishing wood

Supplies

18 - 1 ¼" Pocket Hole Screws

Sandpaper

3/8" spade bit

18-3/8-in-16 x 3-in bolts

18-3/8-in-16 hex nuts

18-3/8-in x 7/8-in flat washers

Paint or stain

48- 1 ¼" wood screws

Optional: Spray paint for bolts, washers, and hex nuts if they are not available in the color of your choice. If spraying, do this before assembling the table. Give the paint plenty of time to dry.

Cut List

2 - 1x2x96"

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6 boards @ 18"

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Step 1

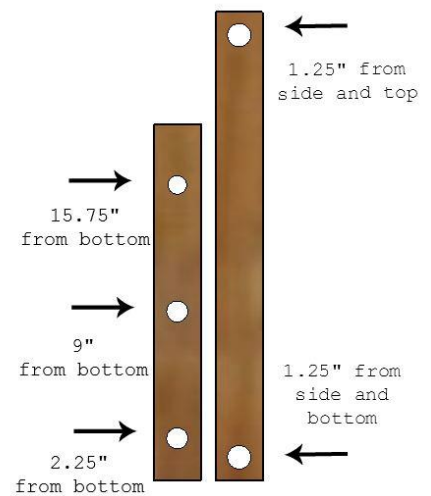
Cut boards according to cut list.

Drill holes with 3/8" spade bit.

12 - @ 19"

9 - @ 25"

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Step 2

Drill pocket holes in

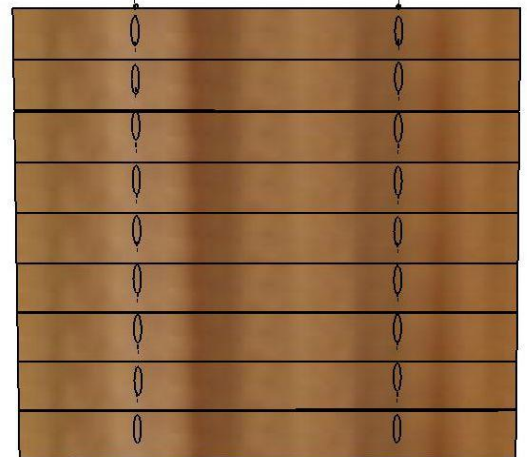
the 25" boards.

They should be 6" from

the edge of each side.

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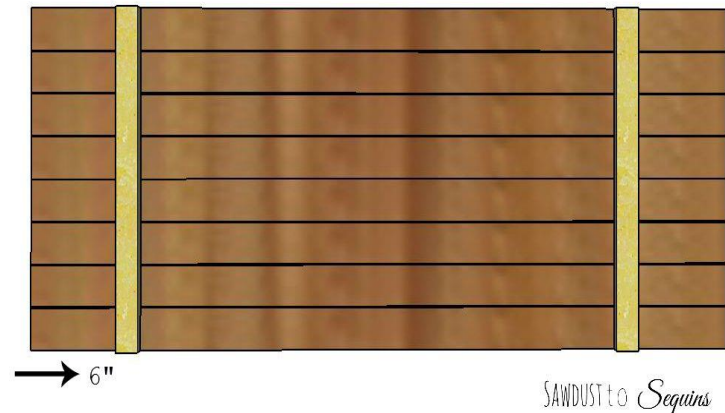
Step 3

Completely sand your boards and paint or stain. This is very difficult to

do once the table is assembled.

Step 4

Place two of the 18" 1x2 boards across eight of your 48" 1x3 boards and screw in with 1 ¼" wood screws. Repeat until you have three shelf units. 1x2 boards should be placed 6" from each edge.



Step 5

Place 3 – 1x3 @ 25" between 3- 1x3 @ 19". Secure with a bolt, washer, and hex nut. The holes drilled with the spade bit will be the placement of the boards. Tighten the nuts to ensure the stability of the table. Make three of these.



Step 6

Attach the shelf units you assembled in step 4 to the leg supports with pocket hole screws.



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*If some of your nuts and bolts have unpainted surfaces, spray paint on a foam or craft brush and wipe on. Allow adequate time to dry.
