


Laundry Table (Fold and Iron)


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<u>Tools</u>	<u>Supplies</u>	
Saw	22 - 2.5" pocket hole screws	Tape Measure
Drill	4 – 1.25" pocket hole screws	Pen or Pencil
Pocket Hole Jig	Safety Gear (glasses and hearing)	3/8" Staples
Sander	Fabric and backing (20"x40")	
Stapler		


Cut List



- 4 2"x3" boards @ 38"
- 2 2"x3" Boards @ 31"
- 1-1"x2" Board @ 31"
- 2 2"x3" Boards @ 13"



Pocket Hole Placement



<u>Step 1</u>

Cut your boards according to the cut list.

<u>Step 2</u>


Drill the pocket holes in the boards according to the diagram. Make sure to adjust your pocket hole jig when drilling for different size wood.

Step 3

Using 2.5" pocket hole screws, assemble the legs by joining the 13" 2"x3" board between two of the 38" 2"x3" boards. Assemble two leg units.

<u>Step 4</u>


Using 2.5" pocket hole screws, attach the front and back support boards (31" 2x3" boards) to the leg units to form the body of the table.



<u>Step 5</u>

Using 1.25" pocket hole screws attatch the middle support board to the back legs of the table. Place this board 17" from the bottom.

<u>Step 6</u>



Cover your ¾" plywood in backing then fabric of your choice. Your fabric and backing should be cut 2" larger than the plywood. Wrap the backing over the edge and staple around the perimeter of the plywood, pulling slightly tight to get the wrinkles out. Repeat this process with your fabric.

<u>Step 7</u>

Sand your table and finish with


the paint or stain of your choice.

<u>Step 8</u>

Place the fabric covered top on

the body of the table. Attach

with 2.5" pocket hole screws.
